SMART FIREPLACE PLACEMENT IDEAS FOR DESIGNERS



- 1. **USE VERTICALITY**: RECESS WALL-MOUNTED ELECTRIC FIREPLACES
 BETWEEN SHELVING OR ART NICHES TO SAVE FLOOR SPACE.
- DIVIDE & DEFINE: USE AN ELECTRIC FIREPLACE AS A ROOM DIVIDER
 IN OPEN LAYOUTS STYLISH AND FUNCTIONAL.
- 3. CREATE FOCAL FLOW: POSITION FIREPLACES OPPOSITE NATURAL LIGHT SOURCES FOR DEPTH AND AMBIANCE.
- 4. LAYER TEXTURES: COMBINE SLEEK ELECTRIC FIRE FEATURES WITH WARM STONE, MATTE TILE, OR WOOD FOR TACTILE CONTRAST.
- 5. INTEGRATE TECH SEAMLESSLY: MANY LCD FIREPLACES CAN SYNC WITH SMART HOME SYSTEMS FOR EFFORTLESS CONTROL.
